LETTER SAMPLE FROM SERVICEMEMBER'S COMMANDING OFFICER

RE: Servicemember's Name - Denial of Leave for Court Appearance

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

I am the commanding officer of (SERVICEMEMBER NAME), SSN. HIS or HER current military duty prevents HIS or HER appearance in court on (DATE OF HEARING). SERVICEMEMBER NAME has requested leave for this court appearance. I have denied this request, and military leave is not authorized for SERVICEMEMBER NAME at this time. This denial is permitted under 50 U.S.C. § 3932(b)(2)(B) and this court must stay this action for a period of not less than 90 days. 50 U.S.C. § 3932(b)(1). Should this court require any further information from me, please do not hesitate to contact me at any of the methods below.

LAW YOU SHOULD KNOW:

The purpose of the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) is to provide protection to servicemembers who have difficulty meeting their financial and legal obligations because of their military service. If you are sued while on active duty then the SCRA allows the court to stay the action for at least 90 days. See 50 U.S.C. § 3932. This applies to all civil (not criminal) judicial and administrative hearings.

Any member of the uniformed services on active duty is covered under the SCRA. This includes Reserve component personnel called to active duty, Coast Guard personnel, as well as officers of the Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

ABOUT THIS SAMPLE LETTER:

- This letter provides the required statement from a servicemember's Commanding Officer explaining how current military service prohibits the servicemember from appearing in court and that military leave is not allowed at this time.
- Read over this letter and make sure the information you have given is correct and complete. The letter in this packet is not based upon any specific state law or jurisdiction. The letter may need to be modified before use in any specific jurisdiction.
